Lent

Dear WIC family:

Frederick Buechner, a Presbyterian pastor and author, suggests some questions for Christians to ask themselves during Lent.

- When you look in the mirror, what do you most *like* of what you see, and what most *disappoints* you?
- In 25 words or less, what is the last message you would give to the people dearest to you?
- What is the thing you have done that you would most like to undo?
- What person or cause would you die for?
- If this were the last day of your life, what would you do?

Answering these questions, Buechner suggests, can help us to see who we are, and whom we are becoming.

The movement of Lent, calling us back to faithfulness, and turning us toward Jerusalem, and the cross and resurrection, is a movement that insists on possibility. No matter what “the thing you have done that you would most like to undo,” God can do something new and beautiful with your life.

Even if they have disappointed you bitterly, God can do something new and beautiful with your children, or parents, or spouse, or friends.

Watch and see the amazing things God can do!

12 March – Gregory the Great, Bishop of Rome (c.540-604). Gregory was a successful politician and a monk, both before becoming pope. As pope, he was energetic and influential, establishing a lectionary and related prayers, outlining the duties of parish pastors, and being influential enough in church music to have Gregonian chant named after him.

17 March – Patrick, bishop, missionary to Ireland (c. 390-461). First brought to Ireland as a slave, Patrick returned as a missionary.
